The word worship comes from an old English term that was not originally religious in connotation. Worship simply meant "to ascribe honor to something or someone because of its/their ultimate importance." This is what we do when we worship God.

*AFFIRMATION OF FAITH (ALL)

A Declaration of Faith

God restored some of the people to their land and left others scattered over the earth. In a time of exile and alien rule, the Jews survived and multiplied. They enriched the whole world: they compiled the Scriptures, preserving God's Word to them; they sang their songs of praise and lamentation; they sought wisdom, examining God's ways in the world; they searched the mysteries of rising and falling kingdoms and set their hope on the kingdom of God. We testify that God is faithful. Even when we are faithless, God remains faithful. The Lord still brings from oppressed and uprooted peoples riches of insight and daring visions that can judge and bless the world. We can have confidence in God's coming kingdom even in the darkest times.

After we hear the good news, we stand to say what we believe in an Affirmation of Faith. Often these words come from the church's creeds and confessions. In these writings, we remember and tell the world who we are, what we believe, and how we hope to live according to God's Way.

Our continual reflective journey is represented by diverse animal tracks inside the heart in the lower part of the banners. Lastly, the soul permeates all other quadrants by appearing in the corners, just as God's light within us glows in all aspects of our lives. —artist Hannah Garrity
