Brief Statement of Faith

We trust in God, the Holy Spirit, everywhere, the giver and renewer of life. The Spirit justifies us by grace through faith, sets us free to accept ourselves and to love God and neighbor, and binds us together with all believers in the one body of Christ, the Church. The same Spirit who inspired the prophets and apostles rules our faith and life in Christ through Scripture, engages us through the Word proclaimed, claims us in the waters of baptism, feeds us with the bread of life and the cup of salvation, and calls women and men to all ministries of the church. With believers in every time and place, we rejoice that nothing in life or in death can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. Amen.

In 1983, the United Presbyterian Church U.S.A. and the Presbyterian Church U.S. reunited after a separation of 124 years. A new confession. in addition to the confessional documents of the two previous denominations, seemed to be needed as common theological ground to provide support for creating and building the identity of the new denomination. In typical Presbyterian manner, the whole church was included in the process of writing this new confession. A special committee worked for five vears to produce a draft of A Brief Statement of Faith, which was ultimately finalized and added to The Book of Confessions in 1991.




