On Palm Sunday, the first day of Holy Week, we enter again into the drama of the triumphal entry, trial, last supper, and crucifixion, remembering together the suffering love, poignant prayers, and prophetic teachings of our Lord. During Holy Week, we hear the fullness of Christ's passion, his death, and resurrection. From Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and on to the Triduum (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday), all of Holy Week focuses on the passion. As his followers, we travel Christ's path of servant hood through the Lord's Supper and the suffering of the cross toward the glory of Easter, all of which underscores the inseparable link between the death and

resurrection of Jesus.


