Apostles Creed

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ His only Son our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost; the holy catholic church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen.

This creed is called the Apostles' Creed not because it was produced by the apostles themselves but because it contains a brief summary of their teachings. It sets forth their doctrine "in sublime simplicity, in unsurpassable brevity, in beautiful order, and with liturgical solemnity." In its present form it is dated no later than the fourth century. More than any other Christian creed, it may justly be called an ecumenical symbol of faith.

To Ponder Prayerfully What is the Truth

((τ HEN JESUS SAYS THAT HE HAS COME TO BEAR WITNESS TO THE TRUTH, PILATE ASKS, "WHAT IS TRUTH?" (JOHN 18: 38). CONTRARY TO THE TRADITIONAL VIEW THAT HIS QUESTION IS CYNICAL, IT IS POSSIBLE THAT HE ASKS IT WITH A LUMP IN HIS THROAT. INSTEAD OF TRUTH, PILATE HAS ONLY EXPEDIENCE. HIS DECISION TO THROW JESUS TO THE WOLVES IS EXPEDIENT. PILATE VIEWS HUMANKIND AS ALONE IN THE UNIVERSE WITH NOTHING BUT ITS OWN COURAGE AND INGENUITY TO SEE IT THROUGH. THAT IS ENOUGH TO CHOKE UP ANYBODY. PILATE ASKS "WHAT IS TRUTH?" AND FOR YEARS THERE HAVE BEEN POLITICIANS, SCIENTISTS, THEOLOGIANS, PHILOSOPHERS, POETS, AND SO ON TO TELL HIM. THE SOUND THEY MAKE IS LIKE THE SOUND OF CRICKETS CHIRPING. JESUS DOESN'T ANSWER PILATE'S QUESTION. HE JUST STANDS THERE. STANDS, AND STANDS THERE."
