




# REGIONAL MISSION TRIP OPPORTUNITY




## MUSICAL NOTES

Rehearsal is a very important part of making music. You want to do your best when presenting a vocal or instrumental solo, singing or playing in a group, or conducting. Many factors come together to make it all happen. There may be spots in the music where there is a ritardando or a slowing down. There may be a fermata, which means to hold the note for longer than its value. Tempo changes (slowing down or speeding up), dynamic changes (loud, soft, or in-between), and even changes in how the piece is played or sung (staccato, legato, etc.) have to be considered. The words

and markings in the music can tell you what to do, but if you are working with other people, you have to make decisions as to how to perform those markings. So, it becomes art. No two conductors will be alike in their interpretations, as no two soloists will be alike as well. I always tell the choir that the Italian words or symbols in the music mean Watch the Conductor. (If you knew these Italian words already, bravo to you!) So, rehearsing with a group becomes very important! It's where the real work of creating happens and a lot of fun as well. This week, the Chancel Choir missed their regular Wednesday night rehearsal due to the storm, along with most every choir on the island. I am comforted by the fact that they know the anthem well. Lay Up Your Treasures in Heaven by Pepper Choplin is a favorite and is sung a cappella (without accompaniment). I'll be singing the solo in it with choir backup. The Chancel Ringers will be playing at the 11:00 am service as well – Suzanne has called a 9:00 Saturday morning rehearsal for the Ringers. We always need rehearsal to practice ringing at the right time. We will be ringing Alleluia for the prelude, and a traditional piece with lots of bell techniques, I'm Just a Poor Wayfaring Stranger.
