

DEAR FRIENDS,

Our Stewardship moniker this year is "Inside Out," referring to God's giving of his love and Son to creation on the outside. Unlike God, we humans don't always know what our insides are saying... until we do something on the outside that resonates. In other words, the more we practice generosity on the outside, the more generous we become on the inside. It always goes both ways.

If you spend a few minutes looking over this booklet, you will be pleased with the role our children played in preparing it. You will also find some interesting data to help you understand more about how church budgets work and how the money is used.

One interesting piece of data in the booklet is the breakdown of giving by age category. It's not surprising that older individuals are the largest percentage of givers, but it's important to note that those under 60 account for only 20% of pledges made. This is partly because the 60 and up age group are the largest percentage of members. But it could also be that younger people have more family expenses to meet. Or, as it has been shown for millennials and more youthful, there is a preference to give to "specific" causes and needs, like "Go Fund Me," rather than to institutional causes and operating budgets that carry administration costs.



If this sounds familiar, please consider your pledge to SSPC a "Go Fund Me" for carrying out God's mission through the church. Which means "why" we exist (generally to be "the body of Christ in the world,") and what this takes in terms of administrative and outreach resources is our total mission. So, if you fit into this younger demographic, please prayerfully consider pledging something. Anything is better than nothing.

Together, we can all be a part of this spiritual journey of stewardship and make a difference both on the inside and the outside.



GIVING FAQ'S

Why does the church need my commitment?

Our Finance Committee and Session use the dollars committed to finalize our yearly budget for the church. Our ministry areas depend on these gifts to continue outreach efforts, education programs, worship, care and new initiatives.

Does the church only want large monthly commitments?

Absolutely not! Our goal is 100 percent participation from our members. Every gift matters, no matter the amount.

When does this estimate of giving amount go into effect?

January 1, 2024.

Can I pay with an EFT or Credit Card?

Yes, you can have your commitment automatically deducted from your bank account each month through an Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT), or you can fulfill your commitment using MasterCard or Visa.

Other ways to pay: Gift of stock, grant from a Donor Advised Fund (DAF), direct gift from an IRA - Please consult with your financial advisor.

Can I make my commitment online?

Yes, visit sspres.org/giving to make an online commitment and/or set up a recurring gift.

Can I change my commitment?

Yes, we know that unexpected life events and circumstances happen. Your estimate of giving can be changed or cancelled at any time for any reason by notifying Jeannine Torbert at 912-638-2220, ext. 102 or jeannine@sspres.org.

Will SSPC send me statements?

Yes, you will receive a quarterly statement of your contributions for your tax records and to confirm the accuracy of our records.

WHAT IS THE MEDIAN COMMITMENT?


In 2023, the median commitment was \$3,000. In 2022, the median commitment was \$3,550

WHAT IS THE DISTRIBUTION OF COMMITMENTS AMONG MEMBERS?

In 2023, the top 10 commitments made up 35% of the budget. The top 25 commitments made up 48% of the budget. While not unusual in comparison to many peer congregations, these numbers reflect an opportunity to improve the distribution of support among more of the membership.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR THE FINANCIAL FUTURE OF SSPC?

Because of your generosity and the faithful planning of the Finance and Stewardship Ministry Teams, SSPC is very financially sound. Historically, approximately 75% of our annual operating budget is funded by members who make a financial commitment. The remaining 25% is funded through the offering plate. Continuing to grow the percentage of our annual budget that is funded through committed giving will allow us to plan more responsibly for the future mission and ministry of the church.



\$141,918 from Operating Budget (40%) \$123,429 from Other Giving & Special Offerings (34%) \$93,160 from Endowment Distributions (26%)



The Endowment committee met and approved a 4% distribution on December 9, 2022. The distribution was allocated on a pro rata basis of the fund balances as of December 31, 2022. Disbursement checks were issued during the 2023 year as recommended and approved by the Session and Missions Committee.

The Trustees will meet on November 10, 2023 to approve an Endowment Distribution for the current year.

The endowment's purpose is to provide members and friends of this congregation the opportunity to practice faithful stewardship of accumulated resources and to insure the funding of ministries of our congregation and the larger church in perpetuity.

An important benefit of making contributions to endowment funds is that the gift will outlive the life of the donor, an effective way of expressing gratitude for God's many blessings.

Once a year, the Endowment Committee meets to make recommendations to the Session for appropriate distributions from growth and income. Although market value fluctuates, no annual distribution will decrease the adjusted basis for each fund.

Funds and income from the Endowment will not be used to offset the general operating expenses included in the annual budget of the church. Disbursements of earnings and growth from Undirected Funds are approved by the Session.


